The MRMC 2026 Field Crew has hit the ground running this season. Since the start of the field season, our crew has been busy tackling a wide variety of projects across our watershed. Through hard work and dedication, we have enjoyed a productive and successful season so far, making meaningful progress toward our conservation and restoration goals.

CULVERT REMOVAL PROJECT

One of MRMC's major projects this summer was a fish passage restoration project on a cold-water tributary of the Morell River. The crew removed a degrading culvert that had become intertwined with a beaver dam, making the site impassable for fish. Native fish, including Brook trout and Atlantic salmon, now have access to one of the coldest tributaries on the Morell River!



ONGOING PROJECTS

Throughout the summer, the MRMC crew has been actively involved in a wide range of conservation, stewardship, and community outreach initiatives. Our team has planted trees along the river to enhance riparian habitat and improve conditions for fish, removed barriers to fish passage, and hosted several educational outreach events at Mooney's Pond. The crew has also completed our annual shoreline cleanup of St. Peter's Bay and continues to maintain the trail and facilities at Mooney's Pond.
